








## **Bilateral Trade Costs: Selected Economies with China (2006-2011)**

Comprehensive Trade Costs (CTC) and CTC excluding tariff (NT-CTC)

















#### **What is Single Window**

A facility that allows parties involved in trade and transport to lodge standardized information and documents with a single entry point to fulfil all import, export, and transit-related regulatory requirements












### **Enabling Cross Border Trade Data Exchange: Common Denominators**

- Domestic legal framework compatible to international legal instruments
- Use of international standards for technical interoperability, including security measures
- Change Management
- Policy Facilitation Framework:
  - 1) Bi-lateral level, ex) MOA, FTA
  - 2) Sub-regional level, ex) ASEAN SW Agreement
  - 3) Regional level, ex) ESCAP Resolution 68/3
  - 4) Global level



#### **ESCAP Resolution 68/3**

## Enabling paperless trade and the cross-border recognition of electronic data and documents for inclusive and sustainable intraregional trade facilitation

- 1. Invites member States to work towards the development of regional arrangements on the facilitation of cross-border paperless trade;
- 3. Requests the Executive Secretary:
- (a) To support and facilitate the process for the development of regional arrangements on the facilitation of cross-border paperless trade, including by <u>conducting studies</u>, <u>developing potential options</u>, <u>and</u> <u>organizing expert review and member consultations</u>, <u>and in this regard</u> <u>to present its results to the Committee on Trade and Investment at its</u> <u>third session</u>;
