




Manifest Statistics Graph








KRA IDF Statistics Graph




DVS Permits Statistics Graph




CHALLENGES









- Majority of Government agencies do not have systems and adequate ICT infrastucture
- Payments through Banks not efficient to facilitate payments to government, the Kenya TradeNet System integrated with the KRA-iTax System which is linked to various banks and mobile solutions.
- Slow uptake and adoption of the new System by stakeholders





Lessons Learnt

- Political goodwill is critical to manage the cross cuting Government Agencies.
- The implementing Agency should ensure proper Coordination of many stakeholders. Involve all the stakeholders from the onset.
- The implementing organisation should carry out sufficient change management and sensitization activities
- Ensure proper Legal and regulatory framework is in place at the initial stage of commissioning the project.
- The strategy adopted by a country is critical:.
 - Off the shelf system or in house developed?
 - Pre-clearance, clearance or post clearance system
- To what level should the BPR be carried out? Complete overhaul of the processes? Will this be acceptable to stakeholders or should set up of the electronic platform take precedence.
- Harmonisation of documentation gradual?
- Don't expect too much too soon.
